

<u>WoTPlot</u>

Before the meeting, several people at the meeting had WoTPlot installed on their Android phones by Matt. It is hoped to be available for Apple devices in due course. This allows geolocated reporting of litter, balsam and other problems with a photo. These go to a Google Map database to allow planning of clear up and highlighting of problem hotspots.

Boiler Upgrade Scheme

- Need to find 200 homes by November.
- Work will complete in Jan 2025.
- Need 70ish people connected to each of 3 sub-stations. These will be selected by the project. £15,000-£20,000 per house available.
- 2 parts

- We will receive around £20,000.
- We will set up a sub-group to take this further.

Trout in the Trym - River Cleaning, Himalayan Balsam

- Crow Lane Open Space tomorrow. Taken out 130+ tonnes of rubbish. Heavy rain exposes more rubbish after cleaning.
- Peter Coleman-Smith did a presentation to BART on 7 March about voles and otters.
- We have connections to Wessex Water who are aware of our work.
- We are expecting to see Himalayan Balsam as early as next week. It is expected to take 3 years to get all of it out and this is the third year.
